Student Engagement Fair - August 20th, 2021

Jeremy and Isis attended and tabled this fair to promote the PHSA to undergraduate students. This resulted in over 20 new members. PHSA merch, including Isis' "It Depends" design, was promoted.

Citizen's Cemetery Clearing - September 17th, 2021

Jeremy coordinated with local citizen George Kemp, graduate students at UT's Department of Anthropology, and community organization Trees Knoxville to clear invasive species from a historically Black cemetery in East Knoxville. The project eventually became the thesis project for

Tatianna Griffin, a graduate Anthropology student, and she led future clearings after the spring of 2022.

Paint the Rock #VolsGetVaxed - September 26th, 2021

Bethany coordinated with Carman North, who is in charge of the Vols Get Vaxed campaign, the Office of Communcations and Marketing, and Julie Grubaugh who is the instructor for undergraduate intro to Public Health course, to paint the UTK Rock and document the process to promote vaccination on campus. Undergrads in Intro to Public Health were encouraged to also document the event for a class project.

Events

Nature Hike at Ijam's - October 22, 2021

A thousand condoms were obtained from the Student Health Center and many were distributed for free. PHSA has a surplus remaining for future STD and safe sex-related events. The AIDS quilt, which was hosted at the campus a little later in the semester, was promoted.

PHSA Socials - Monthly, Spring 2022

Beginning on February 3rd, PHSA began hosting social events for members on the first Thursday of each month. The first session was held at Barley's Taproom and Pizzeria, the second on campus in the Student Union, the third coincided with National Public Health Week, and the fourth was at South Coast Pizzeria. Food was provided to attendees.

MPH Information Panel - March 9th, 2022

Conceived, planned and executed by Eritrea, this panel of PHSA officers and MPH students was held to address questions from undergraduate students in attendance.

National Public Health Week Events - April 4th - 8th

The officers jointly planned and executed a number of events for this national recognition of public health. On the 4th, a table was staffed on Pedestrian Walkway, and attendees were able to pot and take home their own plant. On the 6th, a group yoga session was held. A field day with a vaccination-themed game (and other activities) was planned, but PHSA was not able to acquire the needed equipment from the University, and this event was canceled.

Financials

During the 2021-2022 school year, PHSA's finances consisted of both earnings and expenditures. Earnings composed of dues from new and existing members, and money from various fundraising events. Such events included a potted plant sale during National Public Health Week and merchandise sales. Expenditures mainly consisted of reimbursements for PHSA events, such as Paint the Rock, Game Nights, and PHSA Socials. Our expenditures were greater than our earnings during this school year. However, we successfully managed to increase our membership and hosting events out of PHSA's account helped attract members.

PHSA's ending balance for the 2021-2022 school year was \$746.49.
